Anna Gardella is Team Leader at the European Banking Authority. She has the leadership on a wide range of regulatory issues, with special expertise on banking consolidation (mergers&acquisitions), internal governance, MiCAR, resolution matters and relationship with third countries and their groups operating in the EU.

She has been a member of the FSB Work Streams on cross-border resolution, on bail-in execution and on IBOR reform. She has represented the EBA in a wide range of matters, including in resolution colleges and Crisis Management Groups of G-SIBs, in mediation cases settling disagreements between resolution authorities, as well as between supervisory authorities. She was a member of the EBA Crisis management team during the 2015 Greek crisis where capital controls were imposed.

Prior to joining the EBA, Anna was a Senior Financial Stability expert at the European Central Bank where she was a member of the ECB Financial Sector Team in the context of the Greek economic adjustment programme in Athens.

Prior to joining the EU institutions, she worked as legal practitioner for a global law firm in Milan and was professor at the Catholic University of Milan. Anna holds a PhD from the State University of Milan, a LLM from Harvard Law School and a JD from the University of Genoa. She is author of a volume on financial collateral arrangements and about 40 essays on European and financial matters.
